



MCNALLY GETTING STRONGER IN V8 UTES AT CLIPSAL 500

Glenn McNally made the most of the reverse-top-16 race today at Adelaide's Clipsal 500 by finishing fourth after starting from third place on the grid.

Originally set for a front row start another competitor was penalised in race 2 pushing him back one spot on the grid.

This removed Glenn's chance to get ahead at the start and he was held up early in the race by Greg Willis and Colin Dunn.

The race was interrupted by a safety car period when Grant Johnson has a huge accident.

"I had the pace on Greg and almost spun him at one stage; thankfully he kept it straight," Glenn said.

"I almost got Dunn on the last corner but didn't quite have the legs to make it stick."

Glenn was happy with his pace today and was lapping close to his qualifying time during the race.

"We are going in the right direction, I am getting faster as the meeting goes on even though the tyres are getting older."

"I should be starting in the top ten tomorrow giving me a good shot at a result for the weekend."

Glenn's final race of the Clipsal 500 will be at 10.40am tomorrow.
